<p><b>100% SURE</b> <b>(For sure)</b> Use Simple Present Tense</p>	<p>Derrick <u>is</u> hungry. He told me that he is hungry, so I know that he is hungry. I'm 100% sure.</p>
<p><b>95% SURE</b> <b>(Probably)</b> Use MUST</p>	<p>Peter ate all of his dinner, now he's eating the rest of my dinner too. He <u>must be</u> really hungry today!</p>
<p><b>50% SURE, or Less</b> <b>(Maybe)</b> Use may/might/could</p>	<p>Frank hasn't eaten anything since 10 a.m. It's noon now. He <u>might be</u> hungry. He <u>may be</u> hungry. He <u>could be</u> hungry. But I'm not really sure.</p>
